Visit the beautiful Scottish Borders and immerse yourself in the rich landscape and heritage of the five-star Dawyck Botanic Garden.

A pleasure for all and a must for any garden or tree enthusiast, Dawyck has one of the UK's finest tree collections. It features redwood, spruce and the unique Dawyck beech and is home to some of Britain's oldest and tallest specimens including a silver fir planted in 1680.

The 65-acre Garden enjoys a continental climate, perfect for the abundance of plant species collected from around the world over the past 300 years. It is renowned for its seasonal displays of azaleas, rhododendrons and blue poppies.

Visitors can enjoy burnside and woodland walks, and discover the adventures of plant hunters such as David Douglas, after whom the Douglas fir is named. They can join a tour with a Garden Guide who will point out botanical treasures and share tales of intrepid Scottish explorers.

Others may wish to relax and enjoy the woodland view from the award-winning visitor centre. There, you can enjoy the delights of a traditional Scottish afternoon tea, wander around the exhibition space or browse in the nature-inspired shop.

With its hydro-electric scheme at Scrape Burn, Dawyck is the world's first carbon neutral botanic garden.

While this trip will fascinate garden and heritage enthusiasts, it is also ideal for those who simply want to stroll in natural surroundings or relax and enjoy the peace and quiet.

The Royal Botanic Garden Edinburgh, founded in 1670, is a world renowned centre for plant research, conservation and education. Its four remarkable Gardens – the “Botanics” in Edinburgh; the mountain-side Benmore in Argyll; Dawyck in the wooded hills of the Scottish Borders; and Logan on a Gulf Stream warmed peninsula in Galloway – differ in topography, soils and climate, enabling an exceptionally wide range of plants to be grown. Together they constitute one of the richest plant collections on Earth, with more than 15,000 species in cultivation.
