Herbarium digitisation – connecting science, conservation and global access

Gifts in wills are helping us transform our Herbarium, one of the most significant botanical collections in the world, into a globally accessible digital resource. Thanks to our generous supporters, we celebrated the digitisation of our one millionth specimen in 2024.

By creating openly accessible images of every specimen, we're unlocking centuries of botanical insight, making it available to anyone, anywhere. By including a gift in your will, you could help researchers around the world to better understand biodiversity, track the impact of climate change, and protect fragile ecosystems for generations to come.

How to leave a gift in your will

Once you have taken care of your loved ones, you can leave a gift in your will to the Royal Botanic Garden Edinburgh in different ways.

* Residual Gift

A residual gift is a share of the value of your assets, after all fees, taxes and other gifts have been paid. This may be the most consistent way to leave gifts in your will as percentages of your Estate will always remain proportionate against changes in value.

* Pecuniary Gift

A pecuniary gift is a specific amount of money which can be any amount you choose.

* Specific Gift

A specific gift may be an item such as property, or a piece of art. We ask that you please contact us to discuss further if this is something you are considering.



We always recommend that you seek the advice of a solicitor when preparing your will. When you are ready to, including a gift to the Royal Botanic Garden Edinburgh is a straightforward process. The most important information to include is:
