- We will use our senses to learn more about nature and the garden.
- We will think about ways in which we can help look after living things.
- We will practice the meta-skills of creativity and curiosity.

## What to Expect

- This session explores the outdoor garden in a fun but meaningful way. Through games and activities we focus on the needs of all living things and how we can find all these things in our garden.
- Our Chief Teddy Edward will send a letter to you before your visit to the Garden to set the scene and give you some more information of what to expect. Please read this letter before attending the session.
- It would be useful if you divide your class into smaller groups with an adult so we can use these groups to explore safely and with maximum learning. These smaller groups will always work near each other in the same areas.
- Your accompanying staff and adults will be actively involved in supporting the students throughout the session.
- Our learning team will make sure that children get a short health and safety briefing before the session.
- Most of this programme takes place outside so appropriate clothing and shoes should be worn.
- Please let us know any specific needs of your group beforehand so we can make adaptations if necessary.
